What a memorable – and busy week – it proved to be. Our Classic Course shone brightly as we all marvelled at the quality of the golf produced by participants from the DP World Tour.

Kudos to **Mark Isley** and his golf course maintenance team for producing such an outstandingly conditioned and presented course that was widely praised by players and officials and will have won admirers from all over the world who watched the live broadcasts of the tournament.

A big thank you also to the staff from LNGRC and Dusit Thani Laguna Singapore who made a huge contribution in a variety of capacities, displaying a wonderful work ethic and spirit in ensuring all ran smoothly.

Appreciation also to our Members for their support and attendance at the event, and especially to those who gave of their time to act as volunteers.

In recognition of that commitment, we were delighted to stage Member Appreciation Days on the Tuesday and Wednesday immediately following the Singapore Classic, enabling Members to experience playing on a championship course in genuine championship conditions – impeccable fairways, gnarly rough and true greens rolling at 11 on the Stimpmeter (the device used for measuring the pace of putting surfaces).

To **Patrick Bowers** and his colleagues at Vantage Pointe, the tournament promoters, and **Ben Cowen** and all of the officials and support teams from the DP World Tour, we salute your professionalism and very much look forward to growing the Singapore Classic in partnership with you over the next two years.

No sooner has one major tournament at

Laguna National finished than another is upon us.

In March, we're excited to welcome our friends from the Ladies European Tour for the first leg of the 2023 Aramco Team Series.

With world number one **Lydia Ko** making her debut at Laguna National in an innovative event that has both an individual and team element, it promises to be a thrilling week on the Masters Course.

Mark the dates (March 16-18) down in your diary and make sure to come on down and cheer the girls.

In the coming months and years, LNGRC is committed to bolstering its reputation as one of the region's choice venues for major tournaments. We're expecting to be able to make more exciting announcements in the not too distant future.

One collaboration that has been confirmed is a tie-up with the Singapore Professional Golfers' Association (SPGA). In support of the SPGA, and to help

their professionals prepare and hone their skills for regional and international championships, Laguna National will host one local tournament annually. Further details will be forthcoming.

At the same time, we'll be continuing to organise and stage special events for our Members, such as the mini Inter-Club tournament we hosted with the Western Australia Golf Club in the penultimate week of February. A report and images of the match will be published in the May-June edition of *Laguna Lifestyle*.

Members will also be pleased to hear that our network of reciprocal and affiliated clubs is set to increase with the addition of two well known venues in our region – Bangkok's Royal Gems City Golf Club and the Eagle Ridge Golf Club in Manila.

There's further good news for our junior golfers who, with immediate effect, are

eligible to participate in Club competitions and drive a buggy unaccompanied. This is applicable to those aged 12 and above, with a handicap of 18 and below, and with parents' consent and undertaking of liability.

Throughout 2023, the Club, with the guidance of our Disciplinary Committee, will also be continuing its drive to ensure Laguna National is a welcoming place for everyone, offering a friendly environment at all times.

While it's pleasing that the number of disciplinary cases related to dangerous play at the Club is declining, there remain areas where room for improvement is considerable.

We appeal to all Members to be considerate whenever you're on the course. Safety of players is the top priority, but we still have reported cases of players

hitting into the group ahead of them. If you have the slightest doubt that your ball might reach those in the flight in front of you, then please refrain from hitting until they've moved on.

It's also unacceptable to pick up 'stray' golf balls at any point on the course. If you see a golf ball on the course that does not belong to you, then please do not interfere with it. Just leave it alone. Failure to do so – and other breaches of accepted golfing etiquette – may result in disciplinary action.

In one recent case, a Member has been suspended for nine months for harassment and becoming embroiled in a physical altercation. Under no circumstances will the Disciplinary Committee tolerate rude and threatening behaviour anywhere on the Club premises.

On a happier note, I'm delighted to be able to announce that **SK Ho**, such a prominent figure at Laguna National since its inauguration in the early 1990s, has been appointed to the position as Club Commissioner.

Given his involvement with the Club over more than a quarter of a century there could be no-one more suitable for this important role as a moderator at the Club and a bridge between Members and senior management.

STRYDOM'S SINGAPORE SLING!

Ockie Strydom almost didn't make it to the Singapore Classic. So frustrated was the South African with the state of his game that after missing the cut in the Ras Al Khaimah Championship the previous week he contemplated going home.

"I was thinking of not being here. But my wife talked me into staying and coming to Singapore. She said it might just be my week. Thanks to her," said Strydom as he raised aloft the spectacular Singapore Classic trophy, bringing the curtain down on a memorable return to Laguna National Golf Resort Club for the DP World Tour following a nine-year absence.

Four strokes off the pace in a share of 11th place heading into the final round, Strydom produced a sensational closing round to claim the second DP World Tour title of his career – a victory that saw him edge towards a place in the top-200 in the Official World Golf Ranking.

His flawless final-day 63 contained nine birdies, including a magical four at the long 18th that was to prove pivotal. Having overshot the green with his approach, Strydom was faced with a daunting chip from the foot of a steep slope.

"Before the shot I said to my caddie that it had to be perfect – it's either going to go up in the air and land in the fringe, or if you hit a little bit behind it, it's wet," said Strydom, whose beautifully executed chip rolled gently up the bank, onto the putting surface and came to stop six inches from the cup.

"I took the safe shot with a wedge. It came out absolutely phenomenally. I didn't think it was coming out that good. But it did."

It was a fitting way to end a brilliant day and a stunning week during which enthusiastic galleries were able to admire the power and the skill of DP World Tour members.

For Strydom, making his first visit to Singapore, it was a sensational show of strength – an opening 71 followed by rounds of 68, 67 and 63.

He covered his final 35 holes in 15-under without a dropped shot. Throughout the

week he amassed 24 birdies against just five bogeys, the last of which came at the par-four 10th on day three, his opening hole of the third round.

Despite his remarkable birdie barrage, Strydom had nothing but respect for the Classic Course.

He said: "What a phenomenal course. It's really not easy. You've got to play the percentages and you have to think your way around. There are a lot of bunkers and a lot of trouble."

It wasn't only the course that met with

Strydom's approval, the Dusit Thani Laguna Singapore also scoring top marks. "It's just been a fabulous week. I really enjoyed staying in the hotel and being on site. You come out of your room – and you're onto the golf course. Perfect!"

Strydom's Singapore success came exactly two months after he recorded his maiden DP World Tour win in the Alfred Dunhill Championship at Leopard Creek Country Club in his native South Africa. There he also carded a 63, although that came in the third round.

Yet the week prior to Singapore he was in a state of despair after firing rounds of 78 and 77 at Al Hamra Golf Club, leaving him languishing in 129th spot with only three players behind him on the leaderboard, one of whom retired.

As he basked in the warm glow of his Laguna National triumph, he said: "I was thinking about not being here this week. I was hitting it so badly last week. My coach flew in and we worked hard to get the swing back to where it was. I'm still speechless how it happened. Also, thanks to my wife. She said to me: 'Listen, maybe this is your week'. And it was my week."

Not that winning is a new experience for Strydom, who was an 11-time winner on

the South African IGT Challenge Tour and a runner-up 14 times on the Sunshine Tour before a breakthrough victory in 2019 at the Vodacom Origins Sishen.

While it was 38-year-old Strydom who stole the honours at Laguna National, there were many other performances and performers that caught the eye.

For much of the final day, **Sami Välimäki** was in pole position, the Finnish player recording five front nine birdies, then reaching 18-under after his seventh birdie of the day on the long 13th.

But Strydom made four further gains on his closing six holes, setting the clubhouse target of 19-under.

Välimäki, the DP World Tour's Rookie of the Year in 2020, finished his round with five consecutive pars, narrowly missing a levelling birdie attempt on the last.

Just minutes later, a lightning warning was sounded, the subsequent deluge meaning it would have been unlikely that a play-off could have been completed on Sunday.

It was not only the professionals who caught the eye, but also a trio of amateurs, led by China's **Ding Wenyi**.

In just his second DP World Tour start, 18-year-old Ding put together a

performance that suggests he could soon become a force on the professional stage.

Winner of the US Junior Amateur title last year, Ding held a one-shot lead at the half-way stage after opening with back-to-back 66s. A 76 in the third round saw him lose ground but he closed with a 69 to finish just outside the top 20 at 11-under.

Kudos also to **Ryan Ang**, a member of the Singapore team that finished runners-up in last year's Asia-Pacific Men's Amateur Team Championship for the Nomura Cup.

Thanks to a fabulous second-round 69, he made the cut on the mark. His solid play continued over the weekend with rounds of 73 and 74.

Ang was one of three players who secured their starting spots via the

pre-Christmas Singapore qualifying tournament, along with Hong Kong's **Taichi Kho** and Thai **Amarin Kraivixien**.

Although Kho narrowly missed the cut despite shooting back-to-back 71s in what was his first event as a professional, Amarin made a remarkable late surge in round two to book his place at the weekend.

Seemingly down and out after following an opening-day 72 with a 40 on the back nine (his first nine of round two), Amarin then covered holes one through nine in six-under 29.

His much-touted amateur compatriot **Ratchanon 'TK' Chantanuwat**, a winner on the Asian Tour in 2022, was not so fortunate, his 145 aggregate for 36 holes meaning he failed to survive the axe.

But he was in good company. Among those also making an early exit were three players in the top-100 in the Official World Golf Ranking – South African **Thriston Lawrence**, Spaniard **Adri Arnaus** and Scotsman **Robert MacIntyre** – former Ryder Cup Captain **Thomas Bjorn** and ex-European Ryder Cup representatives **Rafael Cabrera-Bello** and **Oliver Wilson**, as well as Malaysian **Gavin Green** and China's **Li Haotong**.

SINGAPORE CLASSIC

Just like Laguna National Golf Resort Club Members, the professionals from the DP World Tour found the back nine of the Classic Course to be a demanding test of golf.

According to accumulated statistics from all four rounds of the inaugural Singapore Classic four of the five hardest holes on the course were on the back nine with the par-three 11th and 17th and par-four 12th and 16th all averaging above their par.

No surprise either that the hardest hole on the Classic Course was the par-four ninth, which is usually played as the 18th during club play.

With the pros playing from the championship tee, measuring 488 yards, the average score on this hole was 4.30.

Throughout the four days, the hole yielded just 37 birdies, the fewest on any hole. At no other hole were there more bogeys (111), while there were also 23 instances of scores of double-bogey or worse.

There were more blow-ups on the 12th (24 scores of double-bogey or worse) and the 16th and 17th (25 each).

In total, six holes played harder than their par – ninth (4.30); 12th (4.26); 17th (3.20); 16th (4.18); 11th (3.18) and sixth

Given the prodigious distances the pros hit their drives, it's little wonder that the three 'easiest' holes on the course were at par-fives.

The 18th, usually played as the ninth by Members, averaged 4.56, closely followed by the third (4.56) and the 13th (4.66). The most difficult of the four long holes proved to be the 14th (4.84), the only par-five at which not a single eagle was recorded.

Of the 44 eagles that were achieved during the week (including three holes-in-one), no fewer than 22 came at the 18th with seven at the third and five at the 13th.

In terms of birdies, the third hole led the way with 198 with the 13th and 18th in joint second with 166.

The hole with the least number of bogeys was the first (20) while only one double-bogey or worse occurred at the fourth, seventh and eighth.

Stars of the G4D (Golf for the Disabled) Tour gave their time to help showcase the inclusive nature of golf and encourage others to take part during the third event of the 2023 season at Laguna National Golf

Resort Club.

World number one **Kipp Popert** was joined by **Oliver Hirst-Greenham**, **David Watts** and **Geoffrey Nicholas** as two golf clinics were staged at the G4D Tour @ Singapore Classic.

Both sessions were held in partnership with the European Disabled Golf Association (EDGA) and the Singapore Disability Council, with English pair Popert and Hirst-Greenham offering their hand in enabling guests from the Cerebral Palsy Alliance Singapore to learn about the game.

Popert, who was born with a form of cerebral palsy called spastic diplegia, gave a quick introduction to a group of school children before helping them with the basics around putting and chipping.

“Golf has been a massive part of my life,” said the five-time G4D Tour winner. “Not only giving me a focus but also improved the quality of my life.”

“If these kids find golf, be it a hobby or something else to help them, it is an honour to show them this game and see if they like it.”

Most had never played golf before the

fun-filled exercises which offered an ideal introduction to the sport.

“It was so interesting to learn that one of the players had CP (Cerebral Palsy) and it was very motivating to see that he was so good at golf. It made me want to try harder to be good at golf,” said **Persis**, a local student.

Hirst-Greenham added: “It shows that anybody with a disability can play golf. They can just enjoy it at the lowest or highest level. It is just fantastic.”

The second clinic was held with members of the Down Syndrome Association, with South African Watts joined by Australian Nicholas while two local professionals were on hand to assist. “It’s a terrific initiative by the Tour to

always bring in people who don’t get the opportunity to play this great game or who might struggle with certain aspects of life and give them some relief,” said Watts, who claimed his maiden G4D Tour title at Laguna National Golf Resort Club.

“It is great to be a part of. You have always got to look to help others and this is one of the ways that we can give back a little bit.”

Reflecting on his first experience of playing golf, student **Ling Yun** said: “I was a little afraid at first to learn golf, but as I kept trying and practising, I got better and more confident.

“I learnt to focus on the ball and aim. I really like the game as it is fun, and it is played in such a big area.”

Scott Bennett, Head of Communications and G4D Project Manager, said: “EDGA aims to provide opportunities that allow individuals with a disability (IwD) to engage with our game, how and where they choose.

“The G4D @ Singapore Classic highlighted that IwDs could experience the health benefits of golf, create friendships and if they choose, start along the competitive pathway. We firmly believe that everyone can benefit from our great game.

“EDGA is proud to continue its work with the DP World Tour, hosting two development clinics in Singapore for local IwDs supported by several G4D Tour players.”

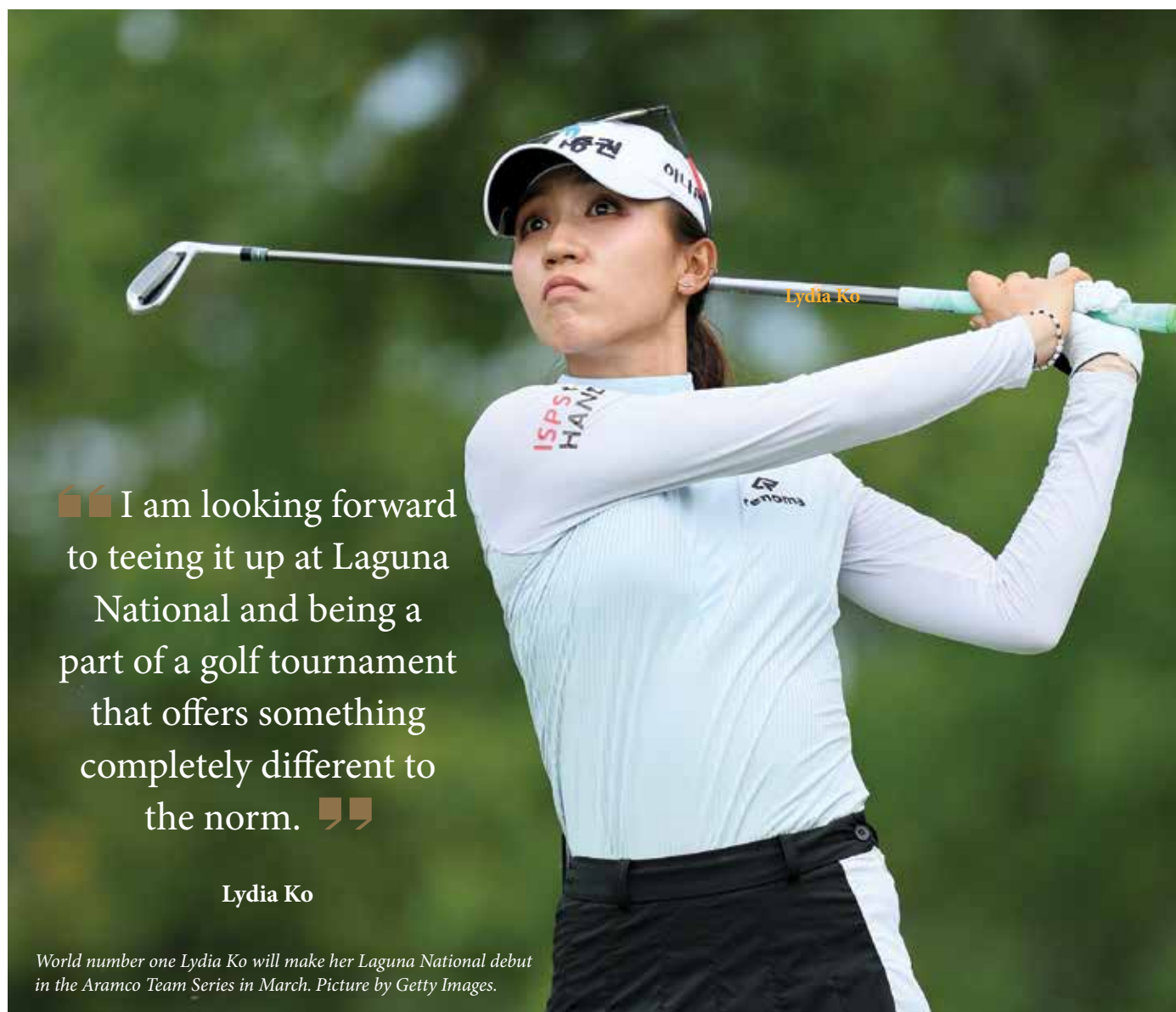

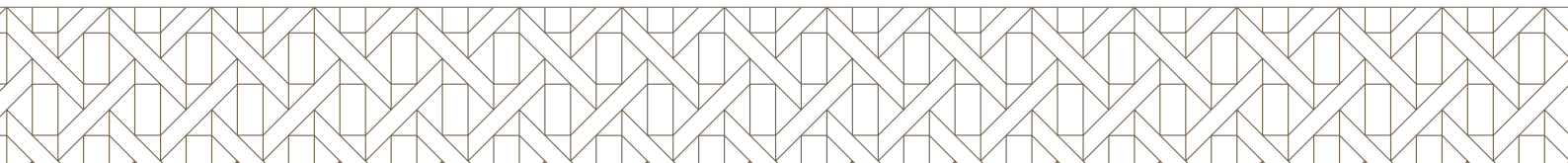

Consider also that no fewer than three holes-in-one were recorded during the tournament – one at the fourth, one at the 11th and one at the 17th. The only short hole at which an ace was not recorded was the seventh.

England's **James Morrison**, a two-time winner on the DP World Tour, set the ball rolling on day one when he holed out with his pitching wedge at the fourth, which was playing to 142 yards.

With a stroke average of 3.20, it was no surprise that the island green 17th proved one of the most demanding tests for the pros, the third hardest hole of the week.

However, it held no fears for 21-year-old South African **Jayden Schaper** during round two when his seven-iron tee shot from 198 yards disappeared into the cup.

Not to be outdone, Iceland's **Gudmundur Kristjansson** made a hole-in-one at the 199-yard 11th hole in the final round.

That masterstroke helped him to a closing 66 that saw him finish in a tie for 49th place, the best performance to date in what is his rookie season on the DP World Tour.

Also among those celebrating recent aces at Laguna National were **David Rae** and **Jayaditya Saluja**.

David savoured the fourth hole-in-one of his golfing career in early December 2022, while Jayaditya had the distinction

of being the first hole-in-one achiever at Laguna National in 2023, on the sixth day of the New Year.

All three of David's previous aces – at West Lothian Golf Club in Scotland, Vicars Cross in England and Whitford Park in New Zealand – occurred on holes where the pin was tucked behind a bunker, meaning he didn't actually see the ball go into the hole.

And that sequence continued on the 17th of the Classic Course when playing alongside his regular partners, **Jonathan Woodward, Chris Emslie and Kevin**

Jones.

David, a Member at Laguna National since 2017, said: "Once again, I didn't see the ball go in as the pin was behind the bunker! But I knew it would be close as I hit a good strike and it was straight at the flag.

"Chris was standing to the left of the tee box as I played and he said he thought it had gone in but we weren't sure until we got to the green. I had great pleasure in ringing the Cardinal Bell in The Nest and celebrating with my playing partners and other friends."

Laguna Lifestyle: How long have you been with the Leadbetter Golf Academy and in which locations have you worked?

Nigel Bark: I have worked with Leadbetter Golf Academy since November 2018, solely at LGA Singapore.

Laguna Lifestyle: What attributes does a good golf coach/instructor require?

Nigel Bark: An excellent listener and communicator. Also, a passion for helping people improve.

Laguna Lifestyle: Most powerful/meaningful golf lesson you've received?

Nigel Bark: Being taught how to develop a system to hit wedges different distances, and always practicing with a target/task outcome, even when working on swing changes.

Laguna Lifestyle: Most common mistake made by amateur golfers?

Nigel Bark: From a technical perspective, I would say poor low point control, with the base of the arc being behind the ball. From a performance perspective, I would say not knowing how to practice on the driving range to replicate course play.

Laguna Lifestyle: Distance or accuracy – what's more important?

Nigel Bark: They have equal importance. Golf is a lot easier if you hit it far, but it's no use if you can't keep the ball in play.

Laguna Lifestyle: Should amateurs spend more of their practice time on the short game?

Nigel Bark: It depends on the individual's abilities. If a player can learn to accurately track his/her performance statistics then they will be more objective with what they need to improve.

Laguna Lifestyle: Who's your favourite golfer – and why?

Nigel Bark: My favourite current players are **Nelly Korda**, **Minjee Lee** and **Lydia Ko**. I can't separate these three as they're performing at levels rarely seen. It's very impressive to see how strong they are in all areas. My all-time favourite is **Tiger Woods**. I grew up watching him break records and

inspiring people like me to start playing golf.

Laguna Lifestyle: Your favourite golfing memory (playing, coaching, or watching)?

Nigel Bark: Two spring to mind. Firstly, my first win as a professional in a one-day event. It was terrible weather conditions, but I managed to shoot two-under thanks to having only 19 putts. The other was getting to walk nine holes with only four other people watching Tiger Woods in 2007 at Carnoustie.

Laguna Lifestyle: Message to golfers who are contemplating signing up for lessons?

Nigel Bark: Come with an outline of what you would like to achieve from your lessons. Be as open as possible about your thoughts. Bring a growth mindset. Enjoy the journey.

THREE STEPS TO BETTER DRIVING

LEADBETTER GOLF ACADEMY INSTRUCTOR RICCARDO CELLERINO REVEALS HOW YOU CAN IMPROVE YOUR DRIVING BY FOLLOWING THREE SIMPLE STEPS.

The driver is one of the most important clubs in your golf bag. Just consider that during most 18-hole rounds you'll hit it from the tee on upto 14 occasions.

As well as putting you in good position to score well, there's no doubt that driving the ball well has a hugely positive impact on the rest of your game, boosting your confidence levels.

For this reason, it is vital to be precise with the fundamentals of a driver so that your prospects of striking your tee shots long and straight are enhanced.



1 TEE HEIGHT

Before you even think about the swing, you need to be aware of how high you want to tee the ball up and be consistent with it. Sometimes golfers tend to hit the ball too low. This will make them swing too steeply which often times results in a high spinning slice shot, leading to a big loss in terms of distance. A good baseline would be to have the ball to sit above the club face when you tee it up. This would make it easier to hit with an ascending angle of approach and therefore have a higher launch angle.



2 STANCE

To have a proper driver stance, ideally the ball would be just inside the lead heel to encourage an upward strike on the ball. To get this position, set up with your feet together and take a wider step back with your trailing foot. This will give you a nice solid base to make a balanced and powerful swing.



3 SPINE TILT

By gripping the club with your lead hand first, your shoulders should be level with the ground. Now place your trailing hand on the club and naturally your spine would want to tilt away from the target. This will support again an ascending angle of approach and also a higher launch angle. A greater launch angle would have a positive impact on your carry distance and therefore help you to hit the ball longer, especially when the course conditions are wetter.

Follow these three tips and I'm sure you'll start to enjoy more success off the tee – and give yourself a better chance to lower your scores.

High-gradient core technology, combined with the continued advancement of Titleist’s manufacturing process, produces more consistent spin and speed performance for even tighter dispersion.

“We’re looking for consistency in every element of golf ball construction, from the aero-dynamics down to the core,” said **Mike Madson**, Senior Director Golf Ball Research and Engineering at Titleist.

He added: “We always want the ball flying in the same window regardless of how it’s oriented, and we want the ball to

produce consistent launch, spin, and speed on every shot.

“Consistency means when a golfer tees up a Pro V1 or Pro V1x, every properly executed shot they make is going to deliver the performance they expect and the performance they trust.”

Along with these key innovations, Pro V1 and Pro V1x both remain true to their unique play styles: Pro V1 offers a combination of distance, spin, and feel and delivers a penetrating ball flight. Pro V1x

is engineered to fly higher and spin more with irons and in the short game, while still offering low spin on longer shots to maximise distance.

“For a Titleist golf ball to be new, it must be better,” said **Frederick Waddell**, the company’s Director of Golf Ball Product Management.

“For us to call it a new Pro V1, it needs to be demonstrably better than the prior generation. We go through a rigorous testing and validation process to ensure the

performance improvements developed by our world-class R&D team are recognised by the golfer when they put it in play and experience the product,” he added.
