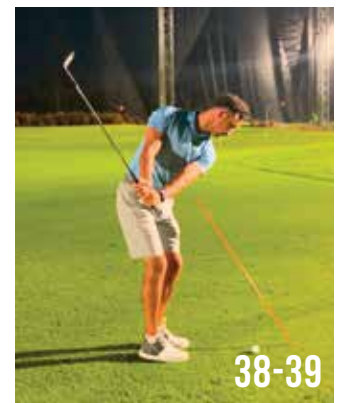

# PINNACLE OF SUCCESS FOR JESPER

JESPER SVENSSON WON HIS FIRST DP WORLD TOUR TITLE WITH A PLAY-OFF VICTORY OVER KIRADECH APHIBARNRAT IN ANOTHER DELICIOUSLY DRAMATIC DENOUEMENT AT LAGUNA NATIONAL GOLF RESORT CLUB.

In edging past Thailand's **Kiradech Aphibarnrat** at the third hole of a sudden-death play-off in the Porsche Singapore Classic, Sweden's **Jesper Svensson** wrote another memorable chapter in Laguna National's book of nail-biting finishes.

Smoothly switching into over-drive, big-hitting Svensson matched the Classic Course record with a closing nine-under-par 63 to speed to 17-under overall and set a seemingly unassailable clubhouse lead.

Playing in the group behind him, Kiradech had other ideas. To the delight of the galleries lining the fairway and packing the Pinnacle Pavilion overlooking the 18th green, the Thai holed a 15-foot eagle putt for a 64 to match Svensson's 72-hole aggregate of 271.

Returning to the par-five 18th for the first hole of extra-time, both men made birdies. At

the second time of asking they could still not be separated, exchanging a pair of pars.

But Kiradech’s hopes of a first DP World Tour win for six years ended at the third extra hole when his third shot went over the back of the green from where he was only able to make a bogey. That left Svensson with two putts for victory, and he took them both.

It was the latest thrilling climax to DP World Tour events at Laguna National, dating back 21 years to **Zhang Lianwei**’s historic final-hole defeat of **Ernie Els** in the 2003 Caltex Singapore Masters.

Three years later, **Mardan Mamat** clinched an emotional success in the OSIM Singapore Masters by getting up-and-down for par from behind the 18th green on the Masters Course – to this day the only Singapore triumph on the DP World Tour.

In 2007, Zhang’s Chinese compatriot **Liang Wenchong** emerged victorious on the same hole after a play-off with Malaysian **Iain Steel**.

After a seven-year hiatus, the DP World Tour returned to Singapore in 2014 with The Championship at Laguna National being won by Chilean **Felipe Aguilar**, who fired a sensational closing round of 62 to come from four shots back.

A remarkable back nine of eight-under 28 was capped by a hole-out for an eagle two on the 18th of the Masters Course that enabled Aguilar to edge out American **David Lipsky** and Denmark’s **Anders**

**Hansen** by one shot.

Another nine years would pass before Laguna National hosted the inaugural Singapore Classic, the DP World Tour’s first visit to the Far East since 2019.

As had been the case with Aguilar in 2014, the eventual winner, **Ockie Strydom**, began the final round four shots behind the leaders before surging to the top of the leaderboard with the low round of the week, a nine-under 63 on the Classic Course seeing the South African claim a one-shot victory from Finland’s **Sami Välimäki**.

Strydom finished with four birdies in his closing six holes, including a brilliant up-and-down at the last which proved decisive.

And so to the 2024 Porsche Singapore Classic – and yet another astonishing come-from-behind story.

Five strokes behind pace-setting Australian **David Micheluzzi** in joint 13th place heading into the final round, Svensson’s prospects of a maiden DP World Tour win appeared slim at best.

But like Aguilar and Strydom before him, Svensson produced one of the rounds of his life, sparked by a blistering start that saw him birdie the first two holes and eagle the par-five third.

He was six-under through eight before bogeys at nine and 10 appeared to have halted his charge. However, he picked up

shots at 12 (where he'd run up a triple-bogey seven on day two) and 13 and then collected his second eagle of the day at the 14th reaching the green with two mighty blows.

Despite his third bogey of the round at 15, further birdies at 17 and 18 meant he matched Strydom's 63 from a year earlier.

Unlike Strydom, though, it was not quite enough to secure victory in regulation time, thanks to the 18th-hole heroics of Kiradech, who was five-under for the final five holes to sign for a 64 and equal his Swedish rival's 17-under aggregate.

But 28-year-old Svensson it was who prevailed in extra time.

Reflecting on his success, he said: "It was nice to finally come out on top. It's very hard to win. It's been a long journey. To win on my first season out here, I couldn't have dreamt of it. It's always been a dream to be a winner on the DP World Tour and to achieve it feels amazing.

"Combined with the Challenge Tour last year and the beginning of this season I've had five second-place spots in the last year. I really wanted to come out on top here.

"There were a couple of times today I told 'Lucky', my caddie ... on 14 we were thinking about laying up and we both said: 'No, we're not finishing second again' and it

was the best shot of the week."

Although he narrowly missed out on a fifth DP World Tour title, 34-year-old Kiradech has much to be pleased about after a welcome return to form.

"I know I didn't get the job done, but I tried everything I could. What a fantastic

finish. Jesper was playing great golf, his drives the last three holes of the play-offs, it's insane.

"I'm just enjoying every second. I'm very proud of the way I'm playing. The result didn't go my way but I did everything I could have.

"It feels good to get back to where I was, and I'm really looking forward to the rest of the year. I'm going to try harder and harder until I win again."

English left-hander **Sam Bairstow** carded four consecutive 68s to finish third at 16-under, one shot clear of countryman **Andy Sullivan** and two ahead of Frenchman **Matthieu Pavon**.

England's **Paul Casey** was next at 13-under, with overnight leader Micheluzzi, Spaniard **Alejandro del Rey**, Welshman **Rhys Enoch** and Indian **Shubhankar Sharma** one shot further back.

Playing alongside Svensson in front of the largest final-day galleries, Irishman **Shane Lowry**, the 2019 Open Championship winner, appeared poised to mount a concerted charge when a birdie at 11 took him to five-under and within touching distance of the leaders.

But while Svensson was hitting the after-burners, Lowry stalled with bogeys at 12, 13, 14 and 18 and a double-bogey five at 17 seeing him limp home in 41 for a closing 72. He ended in a share of 29th place on 280 with Strydom a further three shots back in joint 43rd.

# FIRM, FAST, FAIR AND FUN

THE VERDICT ON LAGUNA NATIONAL GOLF RESORT CLUB'S CLASSIC COURSE WAS RESOUNDINGLY POSITIVE.



Matthieu Pavon described the course as 'a good test of golf'.

Tournament officials and players gave the thumbs up to subtle changes that were made to the Classic Course for the 2024 Porsche Singapore Classic.

"After the 2023 event, we discussed possible renovations to the greens on 16 and 17 to allow for additional tournament pins and the recontouring of the fairways on nine and 13," said **Patrick Bowers**, Porsche Singapore Classic Executive Championship Director.

"Laguna's ownership and agronomy team responded immediately, made the changes and the players and the DP World Tour agreed they were a success in 2024.

"Having a host venue like Laguna National, who are willing to take on board feedback and action it, is a tremendous benefit," added Bowers.

The outstanding conditioning and presentation of the course also received widespread praise thanks, in part, to more friendly weather in the build up to, and

during, the tournament.

Bowers said: "We made a strategic decision to move the event to mid-March, one week after The Players Championship to ensure easier travel for the top players and to take advantage of a better weather window in Singapore.

"We couldn't have been more pleased with the outcome as **Mark Isley** and the Laguna National agronomy team had the course playing firm and fast, exactly how the touring pros love it."

Indeed, the overwhelming consensus among the players was that the course offered both a fair test of their skills and a fun and different experience to what they're accustomed to at courses in Europe.

Leading the chorus of approval was Frenchman **Matthieu Pavon**, a winner on the PGA Tour this year and the highest-rated player in the field at 27th in the Official World Golf Ranking.

Of the course, Pavon, who finished fifth, said: "It's a good test of golf and I really

enjoy the course. It's very tricky. It's windy every day – and the wind slightly changed ... the same direction but slightly different.

"Some of the pins are tough and when you miss them you go down on the banks or in the traps. It's not easy to get up-and-down. So, you have to manage the course on some of the holes and take advantage on some others. Some of the zones where you can get the pins on are tricky."

Similar sentiments were echoed by England's **Richard Mansell** and Denmark's **Rasmus Hojgaard**.

Mansell, who tied for 11th said: "I've really enjoyed coming to Singapore. The golf course is very different to what we play. It requires a lot of imagination, and it's fun. The greens are great.

"There's a score to be shot there, but you've got to hit it into the right spot. You need a little bit of luck as well. If you catch the right slope in the fairway, you can get an extra 40, 50 yards. You have some tough shots with hanging lies. You need good ball

control.”

Hojgaard concurred. “The course is very different from what we play in Europe usually, but it’s nice. Fairways are wide so we can hit it long off the tee, but the greens are tricky. There are lots of slopes. You need to hit the right part of the greens. You really have to pay attention to where you hit your approach shots,” said the Dane, who ended in a share of 29th place.

Despite struggling to mount challenges on their debuts at the Classic Course, multiple DP World Tour winners **Matteo Manassero** and **Nicolas Colsaerts** both spoke of enjoying the challenge.

Italian Manassero said: “It’s a course that you can score on ... but you need to be sharp with every aspect of the game. If you hit the ball far off the tee it helps because

you have some really tough shots into undulating greens.

“Hitting your second shot and being in the right side of the green is really important because you can end up with some really difficult putts.”

Fittingly the last word was with Belgium’s Colsaerts – a former PGA Tour player, a member of the triumphant European Ryder Cup team of 2012 and a man who is fluent in five languages: French, English, Dutch, Spanish and Italian.

“The course has more rolling hills than your links courses in the United Kingdom. The challenge is the perception of depth, which can be a bit tricky, and you rarely have a flat lie on the fairway. That’s a big challenge,” he said.

“ The golf course is very different to what we play (in Europe). It requires a lot of imagination, and it’s fun. The greens are great. ”

In round one, **Ugo Coussaud** achieved something he’d never done before in his career. The French rookie had the rare distinction of making birdies at all four of the par-fives and all four of the par-threes. One under combined on the par-fours, he found himself in the solo lead before he double-bogeyed his last hole for a 65. He eventually finished in a share of 37th place on six-under 285.

In round two, **Andy Sullivan** (pictured above) came home in 28 strokes to match the course record of 63. Starting on the 10th, he took advantage of two of the three par-fives on the back nine but came to life from the first, picking up five shots in four holes before adding further gains on the sixth and eighth to get to nine under. The Englishman said: “It was a weird one. It felt very slow and a bit sluggish to start with and then I just went ballistic on the back nine. I don’t really know what happened. The putter got hot and I hit a lot of good shots.”

# A TOP TEAM PERFORMANCE

MARK ISLEY, LAGUNA NATIONAL GOLF RESORT CLUB'S GENERAL MANAGER OF GOLF COURSE AND AGRONOMY, REFLECTS ON A TIRING BUT SATISFYING PORSCHE SINGAPORE CLASSIC WEEK FOR HIM AND HIS HARD-WORKING TEAM.

**P**roper prior planning prevents poor performance was a phrase drilled into me in my early days as a greenkeeper. It still holds true today.

After eight months of pre-tournament planning, the agronomic team at Laguna National were excited to welcome the DP World Tour and its players to the Porsche Singapore Classic.

Since the 2023 Singapore Classic, we'd undertaken various course alteration projects – the greens on 16 and 17; the fairways on 13 and 18 (the ninth hole for the tournament); various bunker and drainage projects ... and fine-tuning key playing surfaces (greens, green surrounds, tournament tees and fairway landing areas).

Now we were proud to present the fruits of our labour to many of the world's elite players along with a global television audience.

Some think that once tournament week arrives, the hard work is behind us.

I can assure you that's not the case. On the contrary, we're pretty much working 18-hour days, setting up the course prior to play each day and then tending to it when each round is completed.

Tremendous credit goes to each and every member of our agronomy team. I'm proud to say that everyone came together as a cohesive unit, pulling as one in harmony and pouring our hearts and souls into the daily duties which were carried out to the highest professional golf tournament standards and expectations.

Our pre-dawn mornings began with 3 am wake-up calls ahead of the many tasks needing to be completed before play began, including:

- **Mowing and Rolling Greens:** This was the most important task of the day which would begin around 4 am. In order to achieve the desired green speeds requested by DP World Tour officials, a single mowing of the greens would be performed, followed by checking

the green speed. If the green speed was insufficient, a single roll or double roll of the greens would be performed in order to achieve the requested green speed. Most times only a single roll was required, but occasionally a double roll would be necessary, especially towards the end of the week (rounds three and four). At the start of the week, the greens were running at around 10.8 on the Stimpmeter. As the week wore on, these gradually increased to an average of 11.8 per green for the final round. Thankfully, Mother Nature was kind to us this year, providing us with dry weather two weeks prior to the tournament and during tournament week. That allowed us to present the greens with virtually perfect firmness and speeds for championship golf, which was a key factor in allowing the Classic Course to properly defend itself.





■ **Hole Cutting:** For each day of the tournament, pin positions were cut after the mowing and rolling of the greens were completed. As with the green speeds, the tournament officials chose the pin positions for each round. Our job was to make sure the cup-cutting was performed with precision and accuracy.

■ **General Mowing:** Before play began each day, mowing was required on many areas of the course, including green surrounds, and tournament tees and fairways. All this was done long before sunrise, using turf mowing machinery fitted out with LED lighting and very skilled operators.

■ **Dew Removal:** If it reappeared after mowing, it was necessary to remove all dew from key playing surfaces.



■ **Bunkers:** Greenside and fairway bunkers were hand-raked with precision accuracy, while the expansive sandy waste areas were raked with machinery.

■ **Squeegee Team:** Ready and on stand-by with their squeegees – an essential tool for golf courses in Asia – our team did not need to be deployed this year as there was no rainfall recorded over the four tournament days.

Once the players started clearing the course for the day around 6:30 pm, it was time for the night shift to begin. Our key objectives were:

1. Greens closely inspected and put to bed. Tasks included
  - a. Repairing ball marks (thankfully there were very few, if any at all, as the players made sure their ball marks were properly repaired before leaving the green).
  - b. Blowing away any sand that may have splashed onto the green from a bunker shot.
  - c. Hand-brushing areas near the next day's pin positions to remove any lingering grain in the turf near hole locations. This was followed by mowing the brushed area.



- d. Testing soil moisture levels in greens and hand water only where necessary based on the hand-held TDR meter readings. No night time automatic sprinklers were turned on. This way we made sure no excess amount of irrigation water got on the greens which could have compromised their firmness.
- e. Single roll greens to make sure they were nice and smooth before being mown the next morning.
- f. Testing the firmness of the greens after rolling with hand-held firmness meter.
- g. Lastly, a light foliar type fertiliser and/or a soil wetting agent was applied when and where necessary.

2. Other evening tasks:
  - a. Fill divots with sand in fairways and green surrounds.
  - b. Irrigate fairways, tees and roughs, if and where necessary. The idea was to make sure the course played firm, so very little irrigation water was applied throughout tournament week, in order to not compromise the firmness of key playing surfaces.
  - c. Mow semi roughs and player walkways.
  - d. Mow non tournament tees.

It was around 9 pm that these evening tasks were completed. Then it was a quick dinner, a shower and a few hours nap before the 3 am alarm sounded.

It would be remiss of me not to mention **Eugene Hennessy**, the DP World Tour's Director of Agronomy. He started his day with us at 4 am and provided invaluable advice and support before and during the tournament.

This was Eugene's second time here and we're hoping he'll be back with us for the 2025 Porsche Singapore Classic.

Everyone came together as a cohesive unit, pulling as one in harmony and pouring our hearts and souls into the daily duties which were carried out to the highest professional golf tournament standards. ””

**A**rising star of Singapore golf will join the big guns of the China LPGA Tour for the second edition of the Singapore Ladies Masters (SLM).

Home fans can anticipate watching **Sydnie Ng**, a talented 13-year-old, make history when she becomes the youngest golfer in the event's history.

Already being touted as 'another **Shannon Tan** in the making', Sydnie

was discovered through the Singapore Junior Development Tour. She further demonstrated her talent by winning the Future Champions Golf World Championship in California last July.

Her win placed her alongside esteemed champions such as Thailand's **Ariya Jutanugarn**, a two-time Major winner, former world number one and 2021 ANA Inspiration winner **Patty Tavatanakit**, and Japanese **Yuka Saso**, the 2021 US Women's

Open champion.

Over the Masters Course at Laguna National, Sydnie will line-up alongside a host of China LPGA elites, including **Ji Yuai** and **Sui Xiang**, who finished third and fourth in the Tour's overall points standings last year.

For her part, Ji will be determined to make amends for her runner-up finish last year. On the final hole she had an opportunity to force a play-off but missed

her birdie attempt to lose out by one shot to Shannon, then still an amateur.

Sui, meanwhile, will also make her second appearance at the Singapore Ladies Masters. She had a strong season last year, securing her second China LPGA title at the Tianjin Ladies Challenge and adding two runner-up finishes. Sui made the cut in all 11 of her outings.

Featuring a field of 132 players, including 12 elite amateurs, the 54-hole Singapore Ladies Masters will be the sixth leg of this season's China LPGA Tour. It boasts a prize purse of US\$100,000 with the winner receiving a cheque for US\$15,000.

Although Shannon's commitments on the Ladies European Tour (LET) mean she will not be able to defend her title, **Lyn Yeo**, tournament organiser and Founder of LLD Sports, said the Singaporean's remarkable accomplishments last year will inspire all competitors as they prepare for the upcoming tournament.

Lyn said: "The Singapore Ladies Masters was the launchpad for Shannon as she deservedly went on to make further impact on the international stage, especially with her win at the Magical Kenya Ladies Open.

"As we look forward to the return of the Singapore Ladies Masters in June, I'm excited to give our local girls another

opportunity to test themselves and unleash their full potential against some of the best players from China and the region."

It was with more than a tinge of regret that Shannon announced she would not be able to make the trip back to Laguna National on this occasion.

"This has been a very difficult decision. Winning the Singapore Ladies Masters last year has been one of my career highlights," Shannon told the *Straits Times*.

Shannon, who turned 20 in May, added: "This year marks my rookie year on the Ladies European Tour and as much as I would love to return to defend my title, my focus is to be in Europe to further my ambitions to qualify for the Majors.

"I can't wait to play in Singapore again when my schedule allows."

Since joining the ranks of the professionals in January, Shannon posted a maiden win on the LET that has boosted her prospects of earning one of the 60 starting spots in the golf tournament at this year's Paris Olympics.

As of mid-April, the world number 197 was 48th in the women's Olympic Golf Rankings, with the qualification period ending on June 24.

Shannon is also vying for a place at the two Majors co-sanctioned by the LET and the LPGA Tour – the Evian Championship in France (July 11-14) and the AIG Women's British Open in Scotland (August 22-25).

Lyn said the Singapore Ladies Masters remains committed to fostering the growth of women's golf by inviting promising amateurs from the Asia-Pacific region, providing them with a platform for competition and exposure.

To that end, exemptions have also been granted to two leading players from the 44th edition of the Asia-Pacific Amateur Ladies Golf Team Championship, also known as the Queen Sirikit Cup.

At the Singapore Ladies Masters, the top-60 finishers, including ties, after the first two rounds will advance to the final round.

Marina Bay Sands and CarTimes Group are returning as Official Partners of the 2024 Singapore Ladies Masters.

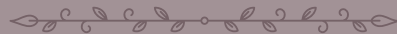

# IT'S SWEET 17 AT LAGUNA NATIONAL!

THREE NEW HOLE-IN-ONE ACHIEVERS HAVE BEEN ADDED TO LAGUNA NATIONAL GOLF RESORT CLUB'S ROLL OF HONOUR.

In the third round of the Porsche Singapore Classic, Frenchman **Matthieu Pavon** struck a towering iron shot at the island green par-three 17th hole. Arrowing towards the pin, his ball looked destined to disappear below ground.

To befuddled television commentators and disbelieving spectators on site, world number 27 Pavon's ball improbably came to a grinding halt just millimetres short of its target.

With the keys to a New Panamera Turbo E-Hybrid so tantalisingly within his grasp, Pavon's disappointment at missing out on an ace was entirely understandable.

On the very same stretch of real estate, Laguna National Golf Resort Club Members **Dicky Goh** and **Mika Orimoto** may not have been competing in the pressure-cooker atmosphere of the DP World Tour, nor was a car on offer for an ace.

Yet they at least were able to enjoy the warm glow of making a hole-in-one on the Classic Course's signature hole.

For Dicky it was the second hole-in-one of his golfing career, but the first for more than a decade and the first as a member of Laguna National, which he joined in 2013.

Enjoying a gentle Sunday stroll around the Classic Course with his wife, **Chen**, Dicky opted to use his trusty seven-iron from the white tee to attack the flag at the front of the green.

"It was a good shot. You can tell if you've hit a good shot in the sweet spot by the sound it makes at contact (with the club face). I saw the ball land above the flag to the right. It then rolled slowly towards the pin ... and disappeared," said Dicky, whose previous ace had come on the 12th hole of the now-defunct Palm Course at Raffles Country Club in 2012.

To commemorate his hole-in-one on February 18 and the fact that it arrived during his birthday month, Dicky organised a double celebration with extended family at the Greenhouse.

Eleven days after Dicky's delight, the 17th hole of the Classic Course was also the scene of Mika's magical moment – believed to be the first time an ace has been

recorded at Laguna National on February 29, a leap year.

The location of Mika's first hole-in-one was especially satisfying given that the 17th has proved to be a painful hole for her since she resumed playing some 18 months ago.

Mika, who was playing with her regular golf partner **Hu Meng** and an overseas visitor, said: "Every time I played the 17th hole, I seemed to donate a ball (into the water hazard). Even though I'd been playing at least twice a week I couldn't remember the last time I'd been on the green.

"On that day, it was just good enough for me to hit my tee-shot onto the green, rather than going into the water.

"I saw my ball roll on the green – and then disappear. The overseas visitor then shouted: 'Ace!' But it wasn't until I actually saw the ball in the hole that I believed it. It was unbelievable and a joy that I have never experienced.

"I'd like to express my gratitude to all my lady golf friends who often play with me on weekdays, and also to **Shinji-san (Fukushima)**, my golf coach at Laguna Practice, and my husband, **Hiro**, who have always supported my golf. I received heartwarming congratulatory messages from them.

"Thank you so much, also, to Laguna National for giving me such a wonderful experience."

For **Kown Soo-jung** it was the 17th hole of the Masters Course that yielded her first

hole-in-one.

A 24-hadecapper who's been a Member at Laguna National for three years, Soo-jung only took up golf again in 2022 after a 20-year absence from the game.

“It was only when my children graduated from university and started to work that I resumed playing golf,” said Soo-jung, who now plays two or three times a week.

On Monday, March 11, alongside **Yang Yoon-young, Choi Mun-sun** and **Myung Hye-kyung**, Soo-jung exceeded all her expectations when she holed out with her tee shot on the Masters Course's penultimate hole.

“Usually I use a seven-iron on the 17th, but since there was a strong crosswind, I used a five-hybrid. When the ball went in, everyone was screaming ... we couldn't believe it! I was extremely excited,” said Soo-jung who will be able to re-live the moment thanks to a video shot by one of her friends.

# SAY GOODBYE TO THE SHANKS!

MERE MENTION OF THE WORD 'SHANK' SENDS SHIVERS DOWN THE SPINE OF ANY GOLFER WHO HAS SUFFERED FROM THIS MALAISE. LEADBETTER GOLF ACADEMY INSTRUCTOR RICCARDO CELLERINO HAS THE CURE.

**T**he shank. It's one of the most dreaded words and shots in golf. One swing everything is going your way, and the next your ball is shooting off at a 45-degree angle and you cannot figure out why that happens.

The 'shanks' are something that can happen to anyone, and at any time.

In order to understand why this can happen, we need first to talk about the anatomy of a shank.

A shank occurs when the ball meets the hosel of the golf club, which means that the sweet spot of the club has travelled too far away from your body at some point of your downswing.

This, however, can happen in two very different ways. Let's explore how.

In the first instance, the club path is too far in-to-out (right of target).

And in the second case, the sweet spot could move out early on top of the target line (out-to-in or left of target) and never make it back on time to contact the ball back on the face of the club.

Although in opposite fashion to the

first instance, that would lead to the same result – contact with the hosel.

So, if you've ever shanked a golf shot, do you know why? Did you go in-to-out or out-to-in? I'm going to explain how a simple test can reveal the answer.

As illustrated in (*Picture 1*), place a ball four or five inches back and outside of the ball to target line in relation to the ball you're going to hit.

If you're still able to shank with this set up, then you're an 'in-to-out shanker'. If your sweet spot moves out too early you are inevitably going to hit the ball on the outside with the toe end of the club before you get into the ball that you are supposed to hit.

While there are always going to be mechanical reasons why a shank occurs, I like to use external focused cues in order to educate the brain and subsequently the body to fix those issues.

The first drill (*Picture 2*) is going to help the 'in-to-out shankers'. This time we are going to place the obstacle (golf ball) inside of the ball to target line. By doing so, there's the possibility of the club swinging too far

in-to-out without colliding with both balls.

In fact, by being able to miss the first golf ball on the inside, chances are that your golf club is going to arc back inside by the time it gets through the ball you are supposed to hit.

The obvious alternative if you are an out-to-in shanker is to place a golf ball on the outside (*Picture 1*). This will promote a more in-to-out club path and you will be more than likely to not shank it again if you can miss that obstacle ball.

As mentioned at the start of the article, the main reason for the shanks is the club moving too far away from the body at some point in the downswing, which is mainly caused by your hand path.

Another drill I like to use to keep my hand path closer to my body is to swing under the alignment stick (*Picture 3* and *Picture 4*, down-the-line and face on).

Place the alignment stick in the ground and make sure you swing underneath it (*Pictures 5, 6, 7, 8 and 9*). This will force you to keep your hands closer to your hips and will help you to find that sweet spot again.

“I flight my wedges really low,” said Spieth. “And as I got to the gap wedge and the pitching wedge (with SM10), I saw some more consistency in the flight, especially on the draw intent shots. That’s always a benefit when we’re looking at left pins and trying to attack them.

“I think (wedge fitting) it’s as important as getting fit for a driver. I mean, these are your scoring clubs. You can drive it to 100 yards all day off the tee, but if you don’t have the ability to get it in the hole from there or really feel like you have confidence in your wedge play, it doesn’t do you a whole lot of good.”
