Ni and **Sydney Ng** in the months and years ahead.

Thanks go to all Laguna National Members for their support in enabling us to stage such high-profile events. A special mention to those who actively contributed as volunteers.

The success of any major sporting event is largely dependent on the vital – and often under-appreciated – roles that volunteers play. At Laguna National, we're fortunate that so many of you are willing to put yourselves forward to assist. We trust you enjoyed the latest unique experience and look forward to your continued support in our future endeavours.

It was notable once more to hear the widespread praise from players about the general condition of the Masters Course and especially the smooth state of the putting surfaces.

After almost a decade at Laguna National in various senior management positions, including General Manager and General Manager of Golf Course and Agronomy, Mark has returned to Indonesia as General Manager at Bali National Golf & Country Club.

On behalf of the management and all Laguna National Members, I thank Mark for his huge contributions and wish him well in his exciting new venture. He will always receive a warm welcome at Laguna National.

I'm also pleased to announce that **Lee Yew Kee** has been promoted to the position of Director of Golf Course Maintenance and will oversee the T2 team. He will be ably supported by **Alagappan** (Golf Course Superintendent, Classic Course) and **Raja** (Golf Course Superintendent, Masters Course).

On the topic of course conditioning, we request for Members to continue to comply with basic golfing etiquette by repairing ball marks on the greens, replacing divots on fairways and tees and raking bunkers.

On that score, you'll have noticed that bunker rakes have been included on all buggies.

Given that both of our courses have numerous bunkers, and not all bunkers have rakes placed close to each other, the new 'rake-in-buggy' arrangement means there is no reason for Members and guests not to rake and smooth the sand traps, thus reducing complaints of footprints in the bunkers and adding to the enjoyment of your round.

We are fortunate that our dedicated T2 team do a fabulous job at maintaining our courses and presenting them in such outstanding condition.

It's gratifying, therefore, to see their efforts appreciated. Led by **Kim Das** and **Sangeet Bedi**, a group of club Members organised a T2 Greenskeeper Fund-Raising Golf and Dinner on May 25. All funds raised from this undertaking go to the T2 golf course maintenance staff. Initiatives such as this are whole-heartedly supported by the club.

As we enter the second half of 2024, there are plenty of exciting club events for Members to look forward to.

Our competitive golfers will have their eyes on the Club Championship and the Club Match Play Championships in September and October, while the second edition of The International Cup has been scheduled for the last Sunday of August.

We'll also be celebrating a number of fun and social golf days including the popular Member and Staff Golf Tournament (July); National Day and Merdeka Fiesta tournaments (August); Korean Festive Kanpai Golf and Member & Guest tournaments (September); Oktoberfest and Halloween tournaments (October); Chairman's Cup (November) and Christmas Golf Challenge (December).

Finally, it's necessary for me to highlight a couple of disciplinary issues that have arisen.

Firstly, there have been numerous cases of misuse of changing room towels – either being removed from the changing room area and not returned, or being used for cleaning golf equipment. Please be reminded that these towels are provided strictly for the use of Members and guests

to dry off after showering.

There have also been several recent instances of Members introducing their 'guest' as a spouse in order to avoid payment of guest fees.

Management views this behaviour as unacceptable and tantamount to cheating the club.

Be aware that errant Members will have to face the Disciplinary Committee with a view to appropriate actions being taken against them.

SINGAPORE LADIES MASTERS

ROOKIE PRO PANG PROVES HER METTLE

MAKING LIGHT OF HEAT, HUMIDITY AND FATIGUE, A TEENAGE ROOKIE PRO CLAIMED VICTORY IN THE SECOND EDITION OF THE SINGAPORE LADIES MASTERS AT LAGUNA NATIONAL.

To compete at the highest level in golf these days, being a great ball-striker and possessing a sharp short-game are not enough to bring success. In addition to raw talent, the demands of the elite game require players also to be strong both mentally and physically.

Increasingly, it seems, if a player is to perform to the peak of their powers, then it's necessary for them to have a solid, behind-the-scenes support team that enables them to prepare properly and focus purely on their game.

At the age of 17, **Pang Runzhi** may be at the start of her career, but in the wake of her maiden China LPGA Tour victory in the second edition of the Singapore

Ladies Masters, all the signs point to an immensely bright future.

A professional golfer for only seven months, Pang produced a gutsy performance in demanding circumstances to emerge triumphant after a gruelling week at Laguna National Golf Resort Club.

Following a marathon final day during which she played 33 holes spanning more than 11 hours, Pang was almost too tired to be jubilant.

"I'm feeling very happy, but a bit numb. I'm very tired and it all happened in a blur," said Pang, who came through the Tour's Qualifying School in February and was making just her fourth start on the China LPGA Tour since relinquishing her amateur status.

"I played 33 holes today and it was mentally and physically exhausting. But I took it all in my stride and I'm really happy I managed to get my breakthrough," added Pang, who had special thanks for her mother and a long-time family friend who also acts as a mentor figure.

While Pang's mother remained at their Tianjin home following her daughter's progress on social media, 60-year-old **Zhao Chunyin** made the journey to Singapore to support the teenager.

"She (Zhao) followed me across all three rounds. She really gave me a lot of moral support and confidence to play well. I told myself I had to endure till the end," said Pang.

A retired fitness coach, Zhao has been

a constant in Pang's life for more than a decade. Since Pang took up golf as a six-year-old, Zhao has overseen her fitness training, with a specific focus on flexibility exercises and yoga.

"During the whole process, I took note of the things to look out for during her growth, helping her establish her foundation step by step.

"Besides fitness, she also relied on her mental fortitude to get the win today," Zhao was quoted as saying by the *Straits Times*.

The backing of her mother, an accomplished former baseball player, was also important for Pang.

"I knew my mother was watching my competition from the phone and I could feel her support. I'm very thankful to have the support from all my friends and family back home," Pang said.

Due to rain, thunder and lightning disruptions on the first two days, Pang had only managed to complete three holes of her second round by the end of Saturday.

That meant a 7.20 am start on the final day. Wiping the sleep from her eyes, Pang proceeded to play the remaining 15 holes in four-under to post a second round 66, matching what proved to be the best round of the US\$100,000 tournament.

Following a brief break for lunch, Pang, who posted top-15 finishes in her previous three starts, was back on the first tee, alongside pace-setting **Cai Danlin** for the shotgun start to the final round.

She reached the turn in even-par 36 to trail Cai by two. But birdies at 10 and 12 saw her draw level and when Cai dropped a stroke at 13 Pang leapfrogged to the top of the leaderboard for the first time.

With fatigue setting in, both players were forced to dig deep into their reserves of stamina with Pang prevailing after making a regulation par at the last for a closing even-par 72 and a 54-hole total of seven-under 209.

Cai, who led after the first and second rounds and played 32 holes on the final day, missed out on the chance to force a sudden-death play-off when her final-hole birdie putt from 12 feet stayed above ground.

"I was just really tired towards the end. I was so fatigued that I couldn't hit as far as usual. I'm disappointed to miss out on the win. But congratulations to Pang for being a worthy champion," said the 21-year-old, who is still seeking her maiden China LPGA Tour win.

Indian **Hitaashee Bakshi** finished in outright third place after signing off with a 71 while Malaysian **Jocelyn Chee** together with the Thai trio of **Chonlada Chayanun**,

Patcharajutar Kongkraphan and **Kultida Pramphun** shared fourth spot on 213.

While Chinese players took the top two spots, the strong Thai presence was evident from the fact that there were no fewer than five players from the Land of Smiles in the top-10 and 10 in the top-20.

For **Ji Yuai**, one of the pre-tournament favourites, there was bitter disappointment. Having been pipped at the post by Singaporean **Shannon Tan** in the inaugural event in 2023, Ji had hoped to go one better this year.

However, those aspirations were sunk in a watery grave on the par-three eighth hole in round two when she took an eight. With rounds of 75 and 78, Ji suffered the anguish of missing the cut by a single stroke.

In happier mood were **Arianna Lau** and **Jaymie Ng**, among the 22-strong contingent of amateurs in the starting line-up, no fewer than 14 of whom qualified to play all three rounds.

Hong Kong's **Lau**, the reigning Asia-Pacific Golf Confederation Junior Girls champion and a familiar figure at Laguna National, recovered from an opening 75 with back-to-back returns of 70 to claim a share of 11th place, pipping China's **Zeng Yu** for the leading amateur award.

“This was my first CLPGA event and I was excited to be able to test myself against the more experienced professionals. I believe I’ll become a stronger player after this experience,” said Lau, who earned her starting spot by winning the first CLPGQ Series event a fortnight earlier.

Meanwhile, 19-year-old Ng had the distinction of winning the prize as the leading Singaporean in the field.

Of the eight local players who participated, only Ng and fellow amateur **Athena Ni** made the cut. While Ng signed off with a 73 for a three-day total of six-over 222 to share 40th place, Ni ended tied for 60th on 226.

Ng said: “I started really badly with a double-bogey but I managed to recover. I’m honoured to win this award and do my best this week. I’m also happy to beat some of the Singapore players like **(Koh) Sock Hwee** who I look up to a lot.”

Although **Sydney Ng** bowed out after rounds of 78 and 79 there was much to admire about the mature manner in which the 13-year-old – the youngest player in the field – conducted herself.

Lyn Yeo, Founder of LLD Sports, the tournament organiser, said: “To break 80 in both rounds was a good effort and I’m sure we’ll be seeing a lot more of Sydney in the years ahead.

“My KPI for Sydney is to win this tournament within six years. She’s my next Olympic hope. I see her going all the way – matching Shannon, if not, even surpassing her.”

For her part, Sydney, a Grade 7 student at St. Joseph’s Institution International, simply wants to get better at golf. She said: “I want to keep improving and I’m thankful for the opportunities that Aunty Lyn and Laguna National have given me to continue to grow as a player. Competing in the Singapore Ladies Masters gave me the chance to do so.”

BRIGHT FUTURE PREDICTED

In the wake of the second successful staging of the Singapore Ladies Masters (SLM), tournament organisers and China LPGA Tour officials were in bullish mood, predicting a bright future for the event.

Lyn Yeo, Founder of LLD Sports, and **Li Hong**, the China LPGA's Chief Executive Officer, said they were confident the tournament will go from strength-to-strength.

The only tournament on the China LPGA Tour schedule to be played outside China, for its first two years the Singapore Ladies Masters has carried a purse of US\$100,000.

Yeo and Li both believe the tournament's status will be upgraded in the coming years with an increased prize fund being the key

to attracting stronger fields.

Yeo said talks are already under way to increase the event's prize pool for future editions.

She said: "What attracts players is prize money, right? Our goal is to gradually increase the prize money each year. I think it's very achievable with our partners and sponsors.

"The Singapore Ladies Masters has also given us the opportunity to strengthen our friendship with the China LPGA. They have been a key supporter since I founded the Singapore Ladies Masters and we look forward to more success working together."

Hong said a larger purse would improve the prospects of players of the calibre of **Yin Ruoning** (fourth in the Rolex Women's World Ranking) and 13th-ranked **Lin Xiyu**

taking part.

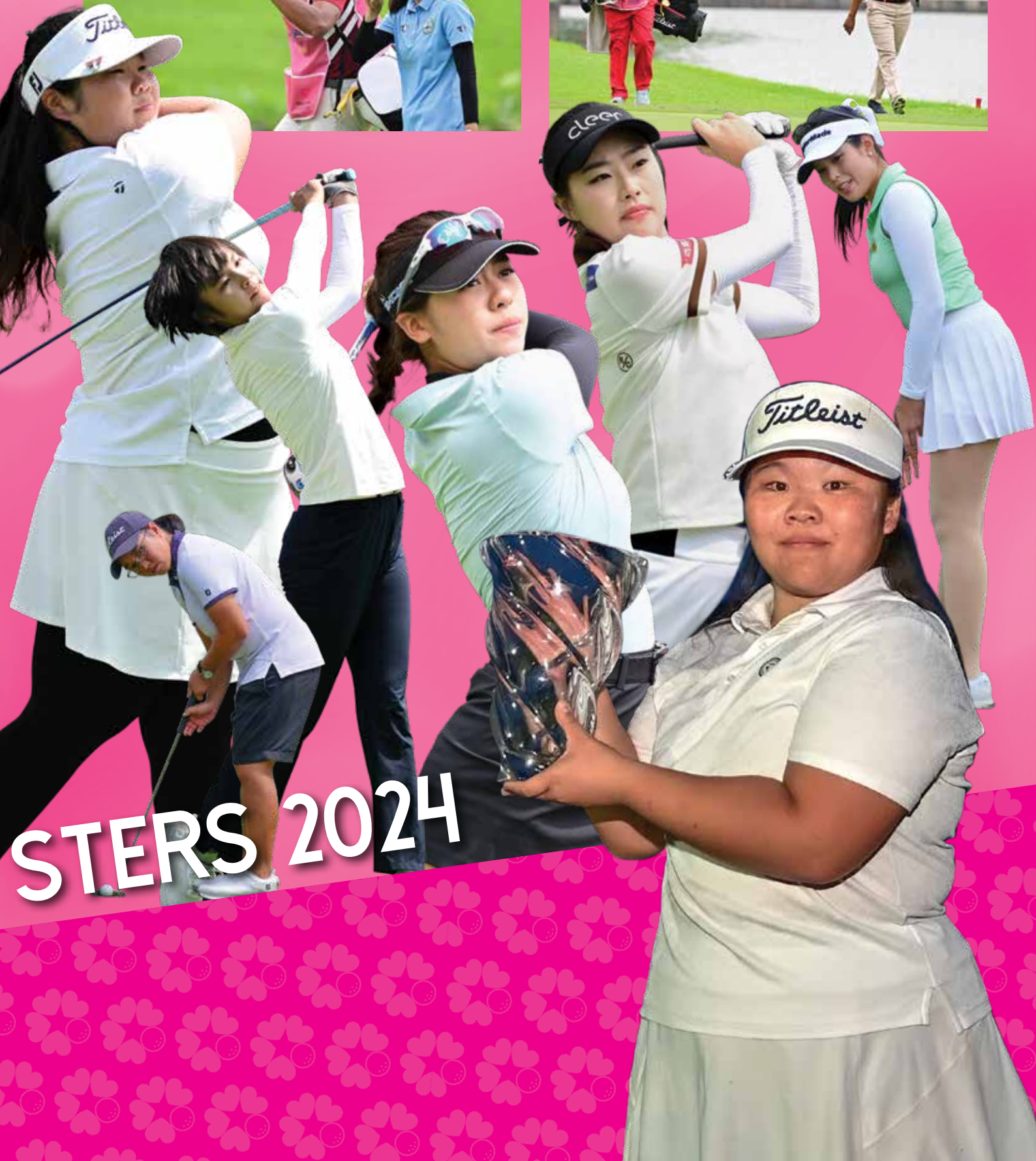
Another enticement would be to add a China LPGA Tour 'Southeast Asia Swing' with an event in Malaysia or Thailand either the week before or the week after the Laguna National showcase.

Organised by LLD Sports, the Singapore Ladies Masters was sponsored by Marina Bay Sands and CarTimes Group and supported by the Singapore Tourism Board.

MARK'S MASTERS COURSE MASTERY! FAMILIAR NAMES TOPPED THE LEADERBOARDS IN RECENT LAGUNA NATIONAL GOLF RESORT CLUB MONTHLY MEDALS.

Mark Bufton continued his rich vein of form with a sub-par turn proving good enough for him to triumph in May's Monthly Medal.

Recovering from dropped shots at the third and sixth holes, Mark covered the final 12 holes on the Masters Course in three-under to post a 71 in the stroke play event.

He was the only one of the 55 players in Men's Division A, for those with handicaps of 8.8 and better, to break par.

It was a continuation of Mark's mastery of the Masters Course. In February, he also returned a 71 which was the best gross score of the day. It translated into 36 Stableford points, good enough for second place overall.

Not content with that, Mark's 76 in the March Medal catapulted him to another victory.

Meanwhile, **Ella Yokota** added to her collection of Monthly Medal titles when she comfortably topped the Ladies Division standings in May.

The multiple Club Championship winner had a run of 12 successive pars (from the fourth through to the 15th) en route to posting a 75. That was eight strokes in front of second-placed **Petra Jarosilova** with **Nicky Hayes** a further two strokes back in third.

For Nicky, it was her third top-three finish in a row, having topped the leaderboard in March and ended second to **Angela Spathonis** in April.

Ella's father, **Sean**, came close to making it a double celebration for the Yokota family in May.

Playing in Men's Division 'B' for players with a handicap index between 8.9 and 16.9, Sean signed for an 81 only to be edged out by a single shot by **Nathan Manzi**.

Nathan's topsy-turvy round of 80 included three birdies, two double-bogeys

and a triple-bogey eight at 11.

In Men's Division 'C' for players with a handicap index between 17 and 26, **Samar Gulati** led the way with an 88 – the only player in the category to break 90.

Using the Stableford scoring format, April's Medal also was conducted over the Masters Course.

With a 39-point haul, **John Ryan** claimed top honours from **Matthew Pollard** in Men's Division A. Eight-handicapper John's cause was significantly aided by birdies at the par-five second and par-four 16th, both worth four points.

The performance of the day came from **Mark Rhodes** in Men's Division B. Playing off a handicap of 18, Mark had a gross 84 which translated into 42 Stableford points.

His round included nine nett birdies, each worth three points. The only hole at which he failed to pick up a point was the ninth.

Law Khim Huat claimed first place in Men's Division C thanks to a consistent round that saw him score on every hole. With 37 points, he was two in front of runner-up **Oliver Andersen**.

April also saw the staging of Laguna National's second Midweek Medal.

Three months to the day after the inaugural Midweek Medal, a total of 28 Members formed two Men's Divisions.

Samir Bedi and **Olivier Magaud** won best gross and best nett respectively in Division A while **Yuan Jie** and **Jeff Zhou** led the way in Division B.

THREE NEW HOLE-IN-ONE ACHIEVERS HAVE BEEN ADDED TO LAGUNA NATIONAL GOLF RESORT CLUB'S ROLL OF HONOUR.

Zhang Qingyi has penned her own real-life Cinderella-story at Laguna National Golf Resort Club.

For Qingyi, who goes by the English name of **Cinderella**, it was a case of a true fairytale as the 24-handicapper made the first hole-in-one of her golfing career on the par-three 12th of the Masters Course.

She recalled: "The shot felt perfect. It landed on the front left side of the green and rolled in the direction of the hole.

son said he did. I was quite confused!

"Once we arrived at the green, my son ran to the hole ... and saw my ball in it. I was so surprised. I never thought I could make a hole-in-one!"

Upon returning to the clubhouse, Cinderella, who took up golf in 2019 and joined Laguna National three years ago, treated herself and her son to a celebratory meal at The Nest.

Also celebrating his first 'ace' in April was **Frank Hu**.

Frank, a Laguna National Member since 2020, enjoyed his memorable moment at the fourth hole of the Classic Course.

"It was quite a smooth swing and a really sweet hit," said Frank, who used his approach iron.

He didn't realise just how sweet until his flight-mates **Oscar Chi** and **Antonio Ivo** shouted: "Wow! The ball's rolled into the hole."

Frank, who took up the game in 2009 and has a handicap index of 13.6, was dumbstruck. "At that moment, my brain went blank! How can this be possible? Is it really true? Could it happen to me just like

Hong Kong's **Arianna Lau** (pictured left) secured a commanding five-shot victory in the first leg of the EFG Bank China LPGQ Singapore Series, which also served as the qualifier for the second Singapore Ladies Masters.

Lau, the reigning Asia-Pacific Golf Confederation (APGC) Junior Girls champion, fired a final-round of four-under-par 68 over Laguna National's Masters Course.

Lau, who tied for 12th in February's sixth edition of the Women's Amateur Asia-Pacific, finished atop the leaderboard at Laguna National with a three-round aggregate of 11-under 205.

Thai amateur **Arisa Bintachitt** and Singapore's **Aloysa Atienza** shared second

place, posting matching 210s after closing rounds of 71 and 74 respectively.

Their achievements earned them starting spots alongside Arianna in the US\$100,000 China LPGQ Tour event. Both Arianna and Arisa went on to make the cut in the Singapore Ladies Masters.

The CLPGQ Series is open not only to women professionals and amateurs but also to male amateurs, offering them the chance to earn World Amateur Golf Ranking points.

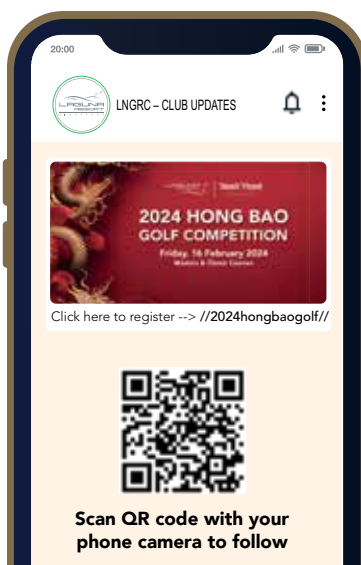

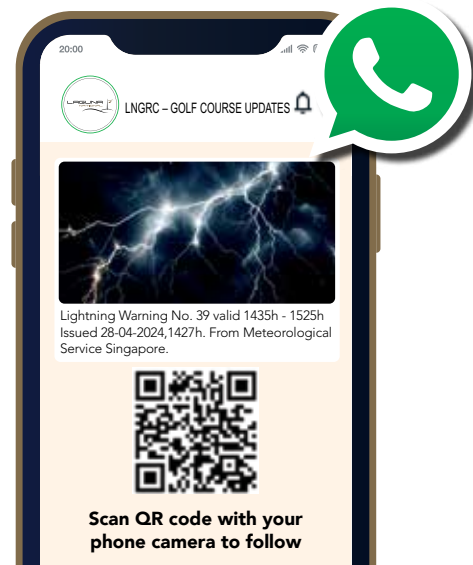

DRIVING YOU UP THE WALL!

LEADBETTER GOLF ACADEMY INSTRUCTOR HAN JI-YOON REVEALS A SIMPLE DRILL THAT IS AIMED AT HELPING YOU TO SHORTEN YOUR BACKSWING.

Many beginner golfers struggle with over-swinging, which can lead to inconsistency and loss of power.

The wall drill is a simple and effective way to shorten your backswing and improve your swing mechanics.

So, here's what you'll need:

- A wall.
- A club (any iron will work).

Here's how to do the drill:

- Stand about a club-face length away from a wall.
- Hold the club upside down with both hands (Picture 1).
- Make a backswing by turning your shoulders and hips until your forearms form a 90-degree angle with your upper body (Picture 2).
- Keep turning your shoulders as if you're trying to make the grip of the club touch the wall. You'll feel a slight resistance when the club touches the wall. This position is the proper stopping point for your backswing (Picture 3).
- Once you feel the club touch the wall, practice swinging through from this position as if you were hitting a ball.

TIPS:

- Focus on a smooth shoulder turn during the backswing, not using your arms to lift the club (Picture 4).
- The wall should act as a guide, not a hard stop. You should feel a slight pressure when the club touches the wall, but don't force it.

By practicing the wall drill regularly, you can develop a more compact and controlled backswing. This, in turn, will lead to greater accuracy and distance in your golf game.

The new Phantom family, offering four unique shapes with multiple neck and shaft configurations, is the result of feedback from Phantom players across the worldwide professional Tours, melded with the continued advancement of Cameron's multi-material construction and face milling technologies:

- Fast-looking head shapes have been engineered to optimise alignment and targeting, helping players easily and

correctly line up the putter at address.

- Cameron's Tour-proven dual-milled face technology is brought to the Phantom line to provide a softer, consistent sound and feel.
- Multi-material face and body constructions, with premium milled-in-USA craftsmanship, are more rigid for increased stability and feedback.
- A new custom-designed, Full Contact paddle-style grip is uniquely shaped for increased contact and comfort, while promoting more face angle awareness.

In addition to a refined, alignment-promoting overall shape, each model features alignment cues that range from elegantly milled sight dots on the 5 and 7 models, to mechanically straight sight lines

on the 9 models, to arrow-shaped lines on the 11 models, helping to give the player a clear pre-putt look towards the hole.

Cameron said: “**Max Homa, Justin Thomas** and Tour players around the world have found success with Phantom putters, and we’re constantly talking with them and learning more about what they want from their mallet. Recently, it’s been alignment that has dominated those conversations.

The Phantom 11, 11.5 and new Phantom 11 Long Design joined the line and arrived in golf shops on May 17. The Phantom 11.5 is also being offered as a left-handed option.

The 10 new models offer golfers options in 33”, 34”, 35” and 38” lengths along with multiple neck/shaft configurations (low-bend, mid-bend, straight shaft or jet neck). Each putter features improved multi-material construction, dual-milled face technology and refined aesthetics.



Phantom 5: Designed with an updated, slightly more compact shape with refined wing angles to enhance alignment, the near-face balanced Phantom 5 stays true to its Tour-proven design and features a mid-bend shaft, new sight dot alignment and a blade-like feel.

Phantom 5.5: The new Phantom 5.5 model features the same updated head shape of the 5 along with a jet neck for players that prefer the alignment features of a mallet with the toe-flow of a blade.

Phantom 5s: Nearly-face balanced with a straight shaft and zero offset, the Phantom 5s offers the same compact mallet shape as its model-mates with an unobstructed view of the leading edge of the face from address.

Phantom 7: With updated contours, slightly longer wings, new sight dot alignment and a subtle shape shift for a straighter outside wing angle, the Tour-proven Phantom 7 puts an emphasis on alignment, stability and MOI and features a mid-bend shaft.
